Establishment of AEP centers next to ECDs and host schools for easy transition and safe child care .- Project name: Increased access to essential skills, formal and non-formal education pathways for refugees and host community adolescents in and out of school in Nakivale Refugee settlement, Isingiro District through Integrated Accelerated Education Program (AEP).

Targeting out of school Refugee and Host community girls and boys who dropped out of primary and lower secondary due to various reasons.

It has enabled child and youth mothers attend school comfortably as their children are in safe hands at the ECD centers.

Refugees(Congolese(majority), Rwandans, Burundians, Somalians, Ethiopians and Eriteans) and host community in Nakivale Refugee settlement. All AEP beneficiaries had spent at least 2 years out of school due to War, lack basic English language skills and lack of money to pay for education in the mainstream and would be interested in joining school again. With AEP next to the host school, this would encourage transition of these learners into the host school after they have completed the different levels. In addition, some of the out of school adolescents have children and therefore needed a safe place to have their children as they go to school.

The approach taken was establishment of AEP school near ECD centers and hosting schools to encourage transition and safe place for their children.

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Main activities carried out include teaching of learners in compressed AEP curriculum, skilling of teachers to be able to teach learners in AEP and transfer of life skills to learners.

These activities for learners are carried out from the school on a termly basis.

It has built the hope of learners to attaining their dreams inspite of them dropping out of school. It has provided them with soft skills that have enabled them stand out in their communities. There is a big behavioral and attitude change among the learners thus influencing their actions.

1011 out of school adolescents(refugees and Nationals) were enrolled both in primary and lower secondary AEP centers.

No assessment has been conducted for this project. However, assessment for similar past projects regarded this as a great strategy that would encourage transition and sustainability of AEP incase of reduced or no donor funding.

The conducive learning environment that included weather proof tents facilitated learning under different weather conditions. Use of local/community structures encouraged community mobilization and reach of advantages of going back to school. Use of teaching assistants encouraged learners to stay in school since these would interpret to learners in a way they understand hence bridging the language gap.

Use of teaching assistants that are part of the communities(fellow refugees) worked well since they live with them and understand their language concerns.

Use of community structures(CECs) worked well through conducting awareness to communities with these education gaps.

Use of qualified teachers and training them in the AEP curriculum worked well since we worked with NCDC to train them in the AEP curriculum.

There is still a low transition rate of learners to mainstream at Level 1 in AEP primary and this is due to the same constraints such as poverty them prevented them from joining mainstream.

AEP is considered a best practise since it gives hope to adolescent girls and boys that have been out of school for long due to various reasons including teenage pregnancy.
